It's recommended that trauma-informed practices are integrated into your code of conduct. Remember - being trauma-informed is the adopted perspective that acknowledges trauma, recognizes the signs and symptoms of trauma, and takes active steps to not re-traumatize players.

The five guiding principles of trauma-informed care are:

- Safety
- Trustworthiness
- ▶ Choice
- Collaboration
- Empowerment

Best practice for trauma-informed coaching is to model and embrace those five guiding principles.
